The Early Years building has proven to be a great boost to our College with students enjoy the all in one building structure and staff taking advantage of the architecture to collaborate between classes.

Sport Opportunities

Plenty Valley Christian College is proud to be able to provide interschool sporting opportunities in fourteen sports activities across Years 5 – 12. Our primary and secondary house carnivals are always one of the highlights of the sporting year.

Average attendance for the whole school is 93.4%. About half of these absences were medical related.

At Plenty Valley, we manage attendance of students by sending SMS text messages to parents if a student is absent without notice.

Absences of more than two days without notification are followed up by homeroom teachers. Ongoing absences are reported to the subschool coordinator for further followup with families.



Year 12 Achievements

67 Year 12 students were enrolled in Year 12 All of our student obtained their Year 12 Credential

91.04% (61) of students were enrolled in VCE

8.96% (6) students were enrolled in Senior VCAL program

96% of students received at least one course offer from their tertiary applications.

93% of students enrolled into a Tertiary Course in 2020

8 students deferred their courses until 2021

2 students began their School based apprenticeship and continued with their apprenticeships – post Year 12

28 students completed their VET course and Certificates were awarded.

79% (53) students applied for tertiary courses in 2020

The 2019 College Dux was Joel Griffin - ATAR - 97.75

7.46% (5) students received an ATAR over 90+

29% of students received an ATAR over 80+ (increase of 16.5% from 2018)

49% of students received an ATAR over 70+

70% of students received an ATAR over 60+

15 students received an early offer through the Latrobe ASPIRE program.

Financial Summary

The following financial summary is indicative of an ongoing healthy organisation, ready for the next phase of growth under careful watch by the College Executive and Board.

In 2019 we completed a major upgrade for our Year 5 and 6 students who moved into newly refurbished classrooms at the commencement of Term 1. Other refurbishments across the campus included a weatherproof structure over the primary basketball court and foyer to the multipurpose hall for greater sun and rain protection.

A nine-stage masterplan was designed for the future development of the college and will kick-off with an upgrade to the entry of the secondary school in 2021.

During the year we also invested in our systems and IT systems, improving financial reported and accounts receivable management.
